Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed? (Isa. 53:1)

F illed with astonishment and wonder, the prophet Isaiah cried out against the unbelief of the Jews. Years later the apostle John also applied this Scripture to the Jews when he said, "But though [Christ] had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him: That the saying of Esaias the prophet might be fulfilled, which he spake, Lord, who hath believed our report? and to whom hath the arm of the Lord been revealed?" (John 12:37, 38).

What would Isaiah say to our generation? Would he cry out again, "Lord, who has believed our report ?"

Unbelief causes people to be cut off from God (Rom. 11:20). Countless millions hear the report of the gospel today, but how many really believe it?

How many lives are changed because they adhered to the gospel?

And why don't people believe the gospel? Has not the arm of the Lord been revealed to them? According to John, the arm of the Lord had been revealed to the Jews because Jesus did great miracles before them. They saw His great power, yet they still did not believe.

Just like the Jews, many today see and hear all about the power of God, yet they choose not to believe. If the Holy Spirit is not allowed to work that power in a person's life, that person will forever remain in unbelief. God will never force this issue with man.

Even we who believe the gospel should each ask ourself, "Have I experienced the divine power that goes with the Word of the gospel? Have I allowed the Holy Spirit to work in me with the Word so that I live the Word of God? Has the arm of the Lord been revealed in me and through me, and not just to me?"

As we consider these searching questions, let us, with David, cry out for understanding: "Hear my prayer, 0 Lord, and let my cry come unto thee ... quicken me, 0 Lord, according unto thy word" (Psa. 102:1; 119:107).

If we cry out to Him and let Him, He will reveal to us His arm of power and greatness

More on the Carpathian Flood

The need

No camera can do justice to the results of the tragedy. First of all, we recognize the grief in the eyes of the people; afterwards in their devastated houses and gardens. Fallen trees are strewn everywhere! There are piles of shrubbery and mountains of mud with corpses of domestic animals. The harvest is destroyed. Most villagers have no other source of income before the winter sets in. The destroyed streets and numerous landslides add to the desolation.

Today we can admire the peaceful and crystal clear rivers again and be astonished at the fact that they could destroy steel and concrete bridges and buildings. During those awful days and nights the people depended on themselves. Many parents took their children in their arms and fled up into the mountains. In one house, the mother, together with her small children, knelt for prayer, before she left her house. The still non-believing husband screamed at them: "Do you have no fear of dying?!"

Quietly, the religious woman answered, "No, we want to bring our needs to the Lord first and then we will do what we are able to do." Then, in the darkness of the night, she and the children left the house under the pelting rain. It was a difficult trek up the slippery mountain terrain. In a few hours her house disappeared among the swelling mass of water. Chilled to the bones, soaking wet, this family was later rescued from their mountain refuge.

The help

After only a few days the Missionswerk FriedensBote truck, loaded with relief supplies reached the crisis area. Also, during the first days following the disaster, two containers with humanitarian aid from our sister mission "Faith Mission" in Canada arrived in Ukraine. Although their destination was to another region in Ukraine, the authorities were ready and very willing to readdress the container and change the Customs documents to the flooded Carpathian Mountain region. Ukrainian Christians distributed the relief goods not only in the local houses, but

our choir sang and provided music. The visiting preachers comforted the people and encouraged them to look up to God no matter what the circumstances.

The beautiful melodies and the hearty condolences

also on the playgrounds, in schools, on parking lots and sports fields. In this way they proved to the outside world that they were no egoists from a certain cult or sect.

From the cash donations. the local Christian brothers bought potatoes, flour and sugar and distributed these supplies in remote villages where many inhabitants had lost everything. With impromptu services outdoors, or during the scheduled church services,

deeply touched the people. Some of the listeners were converted, and God blessed them with his heavenly peace.

The results of the flood which affected so many will still be still visible for a long time. However, now many people know to whom they may express their needs and concerns.

Add a Christmas card, note or picture of yourself, if you would like. Indicate on the outside of the box top whether the gift is for a boy or a girl and the appropriate age category: 5-8, 9-12, 13-16.

3. Place a rubber band around the box to hold the lid in place.

4. Deliver the box(es) to Faith Mission, 500 Cargill Road in Winkler.

5. Above all, pray that God will touch the life of every child who receives a shoebox gift.

6. Please have the Gift Boxes at Faith Mission in Winkler by November 1st.



Tragedy takes the Tkaschev's only son

The blessed family of our co-worker in Ukraine, Leonid Tkatschev, is still grieving after a terrible tragedy. At the end of July, their only son, 17-year-old Russlan, the joy and hope of the parents, died while he was picking apricots for the family. He was enjoying the summer holidays, when he slipped and fell about 6 meters. After approximately 40 minutes he succumbed to his internal injuries. He passed away with a prayer on his lips, in the arms of his weeping father, Leonid. The Tkatschevs have four young daughters.

Leonid's family has become very special for Faith Mission. Leonid was responsible for booking all the Containers in Ukraine for many years.
