

I'm Alive!!

"Man Without A Face....." Appeared in the headlines of many newspapers 12 years ago. However, as usually the case, the interest soon died down. Since 1996 we have often visited Jewgeni Sewerin; first in the clinic in Switzerland where he had surgery, and afterwards in his home. We have also visited with him and his wife Natasha here in Germany. Today, the couple resides in the Far East of Russia. We keep in touch with them, writing letters and by telephone.

Here is a brief recollection of the events:

Forester in a dangerous district

Jewgeni was a forester and lived in a small village in the Far Eastern Russian taigas with his family; about 150 km from the city of Vladivostok. Huge Siberian tigers and vicious bears roam freely in this part of the country. These large cats or bears can clean up a big cow without leaving a trace behind. Sometimes they also attack people. Natasha, Jewgeni's wife, had been attending a home Bible Study and accepted Jesus as her personal Saviour. This had upset Jewgeni. He jeered and mocked at Natasha. On this winter's day, Jewgeni was on the way to check out his territory. Natasha's heart had no rest, and she had said to Jewgeni: "Maybe you should not go to the forest today... I have a feeling something bad is about to happen". Jewgeni only laughed at his wife's fears, took the gun and left the house.

Here is Jewgeni's story:

In the pangs of death

After approximately five kilometres of walking, I noticed some dark spots on the white snow under a tree just ahead of me. I grabbed the gun from my shoulder to load it with ammunition. However, I panicked and did not get it loaded before the huge bear sprang on me and flailed me to ground. Ordinarily, the bears hibernate at this time; however, hunters had scared this huge animal away from his cave and slightly injured him. Now the animal was extremely aggressive and lurked in his hiding place. I lay on my back, under the 300 kilogram bear, trying to defend myself with my gun. With a single swipe with his paw, the bear hit the gun from my hand, and at the next moment he bit my face. Till this day, my mind vividly hears the crunching of the bones. I felt something hot flowing down my face. Once again, I attempted to load the gun. Finally, I managed it. With one hand I continued to fend off the vicious beast. Suddenly, the bear pushed away my hand with his huge paw and took a second bite from my face. There was now a gaping hole where my upper jaw, nose and the right eye had been. The thought raced through my mind: "The third bite will be my death". I couldn't see a thing; the blood was flowing from my face. After reaching out to find my gun, I managed to close the open rifle with my one free hand. I gathered all my strength and fired!

Saved, however, in desperate need

The shot simply went into the air. However, a miracle happened. The bear walked away. I jumped up, reloaded my gun and blindly fired shots in all directions, until I had one last cartridge left. Then I lost consciousness! In the next moment the awful pain in my head brought me back to my senses. In spite of it all, I felt a joy in my heart; I'm alive!!! I tried to remember my way home and started off, not able to see anything. The tree branches kept scraping across my bloody face. Suddenly I fell headlong into a forest gulch. Although it was not very deep, the way up seemed very long and hard. I shouted for help! No response. Nobody heard me.

God says, "...I will help you..." (Isaiah 41:14)

At the time I did not yet know that God himself came to rescue me. Although I had mocked Natasha, deep inside my heart, I felt that what she had said about God was true. So in my utter desperation, I shouted to God for the first time in my

life.

My trek continued! Countless times I tripped and lost consciousness. I struggled to get up again and walked on. Suddenly I felt a hand on my shoulder. I stopped, turned around and asked: "Hey, who are you? Who is there?" There was no answer. Several times this mysterious "Somebody", touched my shoulder and walked beside me. Today, I know that God sent his angel, to touch my shoulder and lead me on. Suddenly, I felt the firm forest path under my feet; however, I did not know whether I should go to the right or to the left. Again I pleaded with God, and before I had finished my request, I heard dogs barking in the village. My heart pounded with joy when my hands felt the latch of my front door: "I'm alive!!!" No answer. Nobody was home. So, I made my way to my neighbour's house. My neighbour and a few other villagers were sitting around the fire, drinking Vodka. Although already heavily intoxicated, when they saw me they were shocked and shouted with fright: "Get out of here! Who are you? Leave! Go away!" Nevertheless, my neighbours soon recognized me by my clothes. Then I collapsed again.

The loyalty of a marriage or: There is an Awakening!

My wife was picked up at her workplace. Really, I should have been rushed to a military hospital in another village. However, there was only one horse team in our village, and it was snowing heavily. Suddenly an engine hummed nearby. It was an all terrain vehicle which suddenly appeared

through the blizzard. Normally, it did not travel this route. I was taken to the nearest military hospital. There they radioed the clinic in Vladivostok. However, there were many other emergencies, and everybody saw my case as hopeless. Natasha prayed to God and begged the staff to look after me. Finally they responded to her plea and a helicopter was sent. In the clinic of the city of Vladivostok the doctors were also sceptical: "This man will die in few hours! We can't do anything for him." Natasha continued to pray and begged the doctors to look after my terrible pain and suffering. It was because of Natasha's persistence that I was finally placed on the operating table, and my face was sewn up like a corpse. During the surgery, Natasha knelt in the corner of the operating room and prayed. The staff mocked; asking her to get up, telling her this made no sense... Natasha answered:

"It is much easier for me when I pray to God." The head surgeon added: "Even your God cannot help in this case." Nobody thought that a person, after losing so much blood and, with such an awful wound in the face, could be alive! He had walked five kilometres through the forest, totally sightless, and without any help. He was alive! Jewgeni lives!

After this incident I have often shared these words: "I now understand that God wanted to stopme from my sinful way of life. I also understand that God truly loves me!" For several extremely critical months, Natasha spent day and night beside the bedside of her husband. When the situation stabilized, she invited a missionary to the hospital. The missionary explained God's plan of salvation to me. Then, for the first time with a clear mind, I openly prayed to God. "It is good for me that I have been afflicted; that I might learn thy statutes." (Ps.119:71)

Treatments and the special needs

God has led in miraculous ways that Jewgeni was able to undergo nine other operations in Switzerland. These were highly complicated surgeries with the most modern medical technologies. The Swiss doctors gave him their best.

In spite of repeated surgical and sculptural operations, Jewgeni felt that he could not face the public with his "new" face. Therefore, several years later a facemask was made forhim. Since then several more years have passed and it has become old and useless. Jewgeni doesn't dare to appear in public any more. A new mask is urgently needed. This orthopedic apparatus will cost about 6,000 Euro (\$9,200.00 Cdn.)

Jewgeni's testimony has been a groundbreaking report which has led many people to look at their own relationship with Jesus Christ. Presently he needs our help, and we would be glad if our mission friends tookhis need into their hearts.

News from Tuchapy.....(Aug.03, 2009)

Dear all the Faith Mission co-workers:

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

We continue working on the Tuchapy church project. We are doing outside work now. Stairs and stucco on the inside are finished. We are about to install the heating system after which we'll be ready for finishing.

We are still lacking funds. I don't know if we'll be able to completely finish the outside with the funds we have. If we don't have enough resources we will have to put a temporary stop to the project. However, we believe God will not stop it as He is never late to answer the prayers of His children.

In one week, I will write about the baptism and camps that just started today. We expect about 80 more campers. I will also send pictures from the baptism service and camps.

On these pictures you can see two young moms who

were recently baptized in Tuchapy. One sister has two young children and the other has three. The dear sister with three children was faced with a situation which has become much too common; her husband left



her because she started attending our church. Please pray for these two young families.

"Praise the Lord", 2008 was really a banner year for Faith Mission! Faith Mission keeps growing! Faith Mission keeps going! As you will notice on the 2008 Financial Report, Faith mission opened some new mission doors in 2008. The Overseas College Program that we supported last year has resulted in a new program this summer. Three English teachers went back to Kharkiv this summer to teach English to the young children in the orphanages; sharing stories about Jesus in their lessons.

We shipped a total of 10 containers in 2008. Due to the global shortage of containers, cost was up significantly. This year, we have shipped 7 containers to date. Praise the Lord, the global recession has worked in our favour as far as container cost goes. Prices have come down up to 30% in some areas. Also, as a result of our meeting in Odessa last November, a stronger relationship with our agents in Ukraine was established. This has contributed to the expedited processing of Customs documents and delivering the containers in a timely manner. No more storage and demurrage fees!

The drop in donations in the last few months has been a definite reflection of the global recession. However, we trust that you will continue to support our mission and provide the funds we need to ship our containers overseas and to support the special projects as they come up. With the decreased cost per container and you sending us donations as God leads you to, our mission can and will keep going.
