Though most never find this path, we should continually witness to others and try to get as many souls as we can to accept Jesus. There is no attainment great enough to merit the forfeiture of a soul to Satan, for Jesus said, "What is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?" (Matt. 16:26)

Another Soldier Graduated..... Nikolai Schepel 1938 - 2011



Nikolai Schepel has gone to be with the Lord. He passed away April 16, 2011 at the age of 73 years.

We got to know Nikolai Schepel in April 1996, when he and his son Sasha spent a few weeks with us. I have also had several opportunities to visit with Nikolai in Ukraine and Germany. We have very fond memories of the brief


time we spent with Nikolai.

Growing up, Nikolai experienced a lot of hardships including poverty and poor health. He gave his life to the Lord in his teenage years and was ordained as a Pastor in Cherkassy when he was 34 years old. Nikolai was harshly persecuted because of his leadership role in the church. He was put in prison twice for preaching the gospel and sentenced to a total of thirteen years. However, by the grace of God, it was changed to 4 & 5 years consecutively which shortened the separation from his family to nine years instead of thirteen. He was one of very few Christians that received such a long sentence during that time.

Nikolai was a very energetic missionary, a strong leader in the church and has started several different churches. His mission work stretched over a large area of the country, therefore much time was spent away from home. Nikolai has left footsteps which many others will attempt to follow. Now the Lord has chosen to relieve him from his heavy workload here on earth to give him his eternal rest in Heaven.

Because of the few volunteers that are taking the time to come out to help sort & pack we've not been able to send as many containers out and the place has been this full for a couple of months already. We are so thankful for all

the clothing that is being donated to Faith Mission. Our work could not continue without the clothes. We have been told many a time that the clothes are a tool that is used to minister to many a household, businesses and individuals. But the clothes are of no help to anyone as long as they are lying here in our warehouse, are they? So how about it, do you have a couple of hours you could give us? Do you know of anybody that would be able to but maybe doesn't know that we need the help so badly? Spread the word!

Another Great Camp Season behind us.... Letter from Peter in the Carpathians.....

Dear Brother Jake and Faith Mission co-workers! Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Another Christian camp "In the Footsteps of Jesus" is over. It has brought many blessings to all the participants of the camp and for the residents of the Carpathians in general. Hundreds of families heard about Jesus as the children returned back home and brought the Bible stories they heard during the short time in a Christian atmosphere, where they felt love and affection. Many of them probably felt and saw for the first time that there is another life which is quite different from life in their homes.

In order for this ministry become successful, it took a lot of prayer and fasting, which we started several weeks ago. It was a laborious preparation for the teachers and camp leaders. For weeks, they repaired wagons, did painting, fixed floors and did other work. Ten young people from Kharkov, Kremenchug, and Volyn came to help us. They left their jobs and took a vacation for two weeks in order to tell young souls about Christ, and to sow the word of God that changes hearts and souls. Only God knows their future life. But, we are, all together as a team, trying to give them everything that Jesus Christ once gave all of us. I think that even with a strong desire they will not forget what they have heard and seen. We tried to make them notice that much work was done to get everything prepared for their arrival and when leaving for home, we wanted them to know that they were very dear to us. I think that God's desire for our common ministry was not only to work for us but also for Him. After all, all we did was for the glory of our



Lord Jesus Christ because He brought us to this ministry and keeps encouraging us to go on.

In total, we had 240 children and 40 staff members involved in camps in Staische and other villages this year. Ninety percent of the children were unbelievers, Catholics or Orthodox Christians. We are pleased that more and more children want to come to our camps. We just cannot accommodate all of them and this year, more than ever, had to be turned away.

The first camp was in Staische. There were about 100 people, and in the church in the village of Rivne. Next week we

had camps in three villages - Dovgopole, Zelene, Golovy. These are the villages where we have already spent more than a year spreading the Gospel. Our brothers visit homes and talk to the people. We continue to pray that God will allow us to start a small church with the Christian group that is there.

The theme of the camp was the life of Joseph, to show children that the Christian life is not always a walk on the green grass. We wanted to show the children how God can bless us if we are faithful to the Lord in everything, as Joseph was.

With children from the Rivne camp we visited a nursing home. We had a service together with those who live there. One week we had heavy rains, but we were delighted to see that children came to our day-time camps on foot for several miles and then went back home under the rainy skies. The next day they would come back again.

As usual, at the end of the camp we saw a lot of tears in children's eyes pleading to come back again next year. After spending time in prayer, we parted ways with the children. Hoping we'll meet again and also that the Holy Spirit will remind them of what they heard. We were really pleased when the children who attended last year's camp told us that they taught other students at school the songs they had learned in camp.

Of course, as always there were some difficulties with some children. Some teen-agers had already 'tasted' many sins. There were very difficult children that needed a lot of 'talk'. Although they deserved to be sent home, we tried to demonstrate love and forgiveness to them. Had we sent them home, they would have once again felt that they were unwanted and unneeded.

So, every year when a camp is over, we analyze the past year's events and start thinking how to improve next year's summer or the winter camps.

Dear brothers and sisters, on behalf of all the children, leaders, cooks, and the Churches of the Carpathians, I want to express our sincere gratitude for what you have done. We bring glory to God for you and thank Him that He has put a desire in your heart to sacrifice for the cause of Christ. All the churches that participated in the financing of this ministry, this is what God is doing. His plans cannot change or stop, and without your financial support of this ministry it would be difficult. One of the reasons why so many children want to come to our camps is that it's all free for them. Although the actual cost is not small, we tell children about our dear Canadian friends who donate funds and support this ministry through prayer.

You can see the pictures we send for you to rejoice in the fact that you had the opportunity to be direct participants in the ministry and help the children in Ukraine and the Carpathians. For me personally, to witness to the children about Christ, salvation, forgiveness and hope is the most encouraging thing that makes my life useful for the glory of God. Even though there are a lot of difficulties, we want to look ahead and believe that God has prepared a place for us, just like He did for Joseph, a beautiful eternity where we'll all meet together one day.
