Our ministry at the end of 2014 and beginning of 2015 Recent news from The Carpathians of Ukraine......

Greetings, dear brother Jake and Faith Mission co-workers in this new year, 2015!

One more year of our ministry is finished. Looking back, we see God's hand and His leading. Twenty-14 was very special among the 17 years of our ministry in the Carpathian Mountains. The events in the Eastern Ukraine had a strong influence on the people in the western region as many men were mobilized for war and many of them have been killed already. Although it's very difficult, we have to talk about the cause of the war. It is the result of the sinful life of the people, as the Bible says. People are looking for those who are guilty of it but they don't understand that we all are guilty of what's going on around us. Mothers and wives cry for their fallen sons and husbands at war, but, nobody talks about the mothers who kill their unborn children they bear under their hearts. It's an invisible war which is much bigger than the one we have in Eastern Ukraine. It is amazing, when I share that with the dozens of people who come to our church or when we visit in the surrounding villages, you know, nobody blames me for saying that! Some of them came to me and asked what they should do if they had 5 abortions!

Last summer we persuaded a mother who moved from the Crimea not to abort her third child that she thought she wouldn't be able to provide for. Also, the doctors said there were too many risks. We provided a place for her to live in. Praise God, she decided not to do it. I saw her a week ago and she was happy to tell us that she would soon have a little daughter. She has two little boys already.

The last year was special because we had 130 services with non-believers in our House of Worship. These people came to





pick-up humanitarian aid as they usually do every Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 10 am. People come from 30 different villages in the region. We start with a prayer followed by a one hour sermon. We talk about many different topics..... Many people have tears in their eyes. Then we have some time for one-on-one conversations. We shared the Good News with more than 4500 people last year, we distributed hundreds of Gospels and tens of thousands of brochures including the Canadian tracts from Faith Mission, "How to know God" in Ukrainian.

We also worked in the neighbouring region of Kosiv, where we met hundreds of people from 15 different villages. I preached a total of 240 messages last year! This is not only a great responsibility, but it's also a great joy to show those people the way to heaven. May all the Glory go to Jesus Christ, who made it possible with the help of all our Canadian friends and many Canadian churches!

We remember very well,10 years ago when Faith Mission helped us to get beds, blankets, pillows, dishes, etc. for our camps while your son, Nathan was in Ukraine.

Your help has been multiplied many times since then. Thousands of children have been able to attend our camps that were sponsored by Faith Mission. Last year alone, we had almost 500 campers.

Just before the New Year we had "From Heart To Heart" action, meeting with children, poor people, and visiting elderly homes. That was a huge preparation work before Christmas time, which we celebrated on Jan 7th as usual. And, guess whom God used to

promote this ministry? Social workers from dozens of the villages! More than 60 people from the welfare service, school principals, heads of the villages participated in it as we wanted the poorest and neediest children from everywhere to come and receive gifts from God. Brothers from Friedensbote (Germany) helped us with this. In seven days we had 17 services with about 1500 children and more than 600 adults. The children were given Christmas gifts and the adults were given 140 food packages. We visited three homes for elderly people where about 70 people received small gifts. Those were touching moments with people in the wheelchairs, some with no legs or hands, lying in their beds. We also saw a young men on his death-bed. Everybody was crying after the meeting.

We had meetings with children in our churches, in schools and community halls. We invited a choir from Storozhinets and a group of young people from Chernivtsi and Tuchapy. Preaching the Christmas message was the focus of our services. Those were 4 wonderful services. We had children and adults from about 50 different villages. We had wonderful winter weather for Christmas time in the Carpathians – minus 26 Celsius. We also have a few more meetings planned, which I will tell vou about later.

We have 10 refugees from Donetsk (the war zone in Eastern Ukraine) who live in our church building in Tuchapy. Our churches prepared 150 Christmas gifts for the children in the East. Our brothers who came from there told us that the

> situation there is awful. The churches are empty, many people have fled the region. Many other refugees who now live in the mountains come to our church to get some clothing, shoes, blankets and other essential items.

The year has passed by so quickly. God let many difficult things happen and gave us new possibilities to serve people. We are very thankful for the way The Lord is preparing us for eternity and we want to be faithful to Him.

Dear friends, we are very grateful to God for you, your ministry and help. Our ministry in Ukraine is also your ministry.
