# Faith Mission Garage Sale — Thank You so Much for Your Support!

#### May 11th and 12th, 2017

When we started to move the "to Sell" boxes down from the mezzanine, we were all overwhelmed! We did not do our sale last summer so we had accumulated so much in  $1\frac{1}{2}$  years.

I have heard some of you asking, "How can you have a garage sale? What do you sell?" Meaning us here at Faith

Mission. Do we sell clothes at the garage sale? No, we do not sell clothes, or bedding or shoes or towels! We don't know exactly what to do with all the "stuff" people donate; which we are not able to send overseas, so we had a garage sale. Any of you



reading this article that were at the garage sale will know what kinds of things and how much was donated; glassware, Tupperware, electronics, cordless phones, dolls, toys etc, etc, etc! We had so much "stuff" we could hardly find enough tables to display it all on for the sale! We at Faith Mission want to encourage everyone to donate their items to us that we are able to send overseas. We do need to let you know that we can't ship everything that you drop off, and we do have a request; if all of you would bring us only things that we are able to send it would be a lot less work for us! Now all these items, that are donated, which we aren't allowed to send, all have to be sorted through and stored. Then later when we are getting ready for the sale it takes at least ten people, a couple of days to get everything out, cleaning some items, sorting it all, setting up lots of extra tables and setting it all up. Once everything is pretty much ready, two ladies came in to head up the pricing. This was a BIG job! Again there were probably 10 people helping them with the pricing. Prices were very low for the simple reason that we wanted to move out a lot or all of the items. So at the end of the garage sale we had made \$1115.00. Although we were very happy with this, we were asking ourselves - Was it really worth all that work, for just over \$1000?

Now I want to answer the question so many people have, and that is, "What are we able to send overseas?"

We send:

GOOD CLOTHES - that still have a lot of wear left in them, please don't send us clothes that are worn out or ripped CLEAN CLOTHES - we get swamped with clothes that are

much too dirty to send!

SHOES & BOOTS - that are clean and in very good condition


BEDDING - Sheets, pillowcases, blankets, comforters (must be CLEAN),

CLEAN Pillows - we get so many dirty pillows we'd ask that you could please wash them first before bringing them TOWELS & WASH CLOTHS

So many people at the sale asked, "Where did all this come

from anyhow?" Well, people have been leaving a lot of great "stuff" in our drop-off room in the last year and a half. With us selling everything so very cheap because we had so much stuff, the items didn't really get sold at the price they would have been worth. We want to ask that you bring these extra items to the Gospel Echoes Thrift Store, located at 320-D Cargill Road in Winkler, Morden or Plum Coulee Thrift Store or to your local M.C.C. Store.

We also ship many bicycles, we want to encourage people to bring us bikes that are in reasonably good working order. If there is so much to "fix" on the bikes you bring us, it makes it very difficult for our "bike mechanic" to keep up with his workload. Plus, bicycle parts are very expensive these days.
