"He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?

(Micah 6:8)

What does God expect of us? Through the Word of God, He speaks to all men everywhere; He has "showed us what is good and what He requires of us." And what He has spoken in His Word to all must be applied to each of us in particular.

Observe, if you will, that God does not require us to pay for the pardon of our sin. Few could do that. But He does require that we do what is good. One way we do what is good is to not do what is bad. In other words, keep all the commandments of God. That not only means that we refrain from doing the "Thou shalt nots" but that we practice the "Thou shalts."

Paul said, "Do justly." Now this is not the same thing as justice. To do someone justly means to do what is morally right, to be fair. It's another way of saying 'and as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise" (Luke 6:31). It is not, "Do unto others before they have a chance to do unto you." Justice is the way of the Old Testament law: An "Eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth," etc. But Jesus did away with that. Had He meted out justice for us, we would have died on the cross. But Jesus died for us! He abolished the old laws and established the law of love and grace and mercy.

We are to "love mercy," or be kind. Look for opportunities to "do" Christianity instead of just "talking" Christianity.

"Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy" (Matt. 5:7).

We must "walk humbly with our God." To walk humbly, we must be humble. James said, "Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up" (James 4:10).

Due to the restrictions and the limitations, we have not been able to ship any Humanitarian Aid into Ukraine in the last few months. We were able to ship one container into Kharkiv just before the Covid affected us. Praise God, He has opened the door into Moldova at this time. Our plan is to load the third container for Moldova on July 30. Please continue to pray that we will soon be allowed to ship into Ukraine as well. We keep hearing, again and again, that, due to the pandemic, there is a tremendous need for clothing, footwear and blankets in Ukraine and the surrounding



countries right now.

"It looks like these Moldovan ladies are using the English message on this oversized Teddy Bear to send a message back to us here in Canada." We send many stuffed toys. However, we normally do not send something this huge.... Wherever it came from, they were able to send us this "special message!"

We look forward to the time where we will spend eternity in Glory and there will not be any language barrier separating us from these dear people.

The COVID-19 Pandemic "knows no boundaries"

Over the last number of years, we have written many letters and articles of the experiences of our dear friend, Peter who is an evangelist in the Carpathian Mountain villages of Ukraine. It came as a real shock when we heard that Peter was admitted to the hospital, struggling to breathe, due to the Covid-19 pandemic. I asked Peter for a few more details and this is what he sent me this morning.

Greetings Brothers & Sisters at Faith Mission....!

I got sick on June 16. Until June 22, I was treated at home under the supervision of a family doctor. I received many injections and IV's. On June 22, I was hospitalized, and on June 24, I was transferred to the intensive care unit, where I remained until July 7. (13 days) When my condition was stabilized, I was transferred to the department of infections.

On July 14, by God's grace, I returned home. Now I continue my treatment, with pills and injections. I have a prescription for a month. Thank God, my health is slowly being restored. I believe that God will provide me with complete healing and I will again be able to serve our Lord in the church and people who are far from God and so desperately need Him. Thank you for your prayers!

Praise and Prayer....

Faith Mission would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your continued support. As we have all faced our own challenges during the last 6 months, many of these challenges have resulted in fear and panic situations. Many people have experienced shortages. For some it may be something mundane like toilet paper or disinfectant wipes. For others, it may have meant losing your job or the shortage may be food or clothing.

On the whole, compared with the rest of the world, we here in Western Canada, or more specifically, southern Manitoba, have been blessed with relatively few Covid cases and only a few deaths due to the virus. Here at Faith Mission, we had to shut down for a few weeks but since we opened up again, we have been sorting and baling two days a week in order to catch up with the abundance of clothing coming in. Although there have been a few added challenges, we have also been able to ship several containers of humanitarian aid to the less fortunate people in Moldova and Ukraine. **PTL!**

Getting Started - Estate Planning / Wills

(As July/August is always the Newsletter where I include the Annual Faith Mission-BDO Financial Report, I have included this brief reminder regarding Estate Planning and Wills. I guess I could assume that everyone has a Will but I know I would be wrong. Please prepare it now and get it done right.)

How to get the conversation started

Despite how important this conversation can be, it may still be difficult to initiate. There is certainly more than one right way to begin.

Here are a few suggestions to help guide you:

Pick a positive, comfortable environment during a period of relative calm. Don't wait until a time of crisis when it may be too late to make adequate plans and family members may not feel emotionally able to talk.

Be sincere about your intentions. Be clear that you are initiating these talks out of concern that proper plans are in place and are understood.

Stress the importance and benefits of this conversation to everyone affected. One way to do this is to show an example of an estate that was improperly handled because family members had failed to discuss their plans with each other.

Covering all the bases

Sometimes, to be effective, the conversation may need to extend beyond your immediate household.

As an adult child, make sure your parents have their own plans and will be properly cared for if one of them passes away or becomes incapacitated.

As a parent, make sure your children have an understanding of your plans and wishes; if the children are still minors, make sure the appointed guardians are willing and clear on your intentions.

As a grandparent or other relative, ensure your grandchildren, nieces, nephews, etc., will be taken care of through your own estate planning, as well as coordinating with their parents on their plans, too.
