All attempts and requests of the suffering party are ignored

"Long has my soul lived with those who hate the world. I am at

peace: but as soon as I speak, they are for war" Psalm 119:6-7 before we talk about peace in the country, let us find peace in our hearts. Do you swear? Use foul language? Fight? Smoke? Drink? Sin?

- "Yes," comes from the crowd.



If people had God's peace, they would never have started any war. If they lived according to the Gospel, there would not have been this destruction.

There are some experiences that make us all think "that sure sounds like fun". For most children I believe children's camp is an experience like that. Regardless of what country you live in most children would look forward to spending a week at a camp with friends and schoolmates, and if you came to camp without any friends, surely that would not

last long. The children in Ukraine, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan and Moldova are no different in this regard. Every year when the requests start coming in for children's camp I fear that we will have to say no to one or the other. In 2024 Faith Mission supported many camps in Ukraine and Moldova and along with FriedensBote that includes many other countries in the former Soviet Union. These camps are full of children that need salvation, these children need to hear the Gospel and have it explained to them in such a way that it makes sense. That is the purpose of the

camps, yes they get to do a lot of fun stuff there as well but those fun activities are also presented in such ways that they drive home the Bible stories and make them more memorable. The games they get to play encourage them to work as teams just like they need to work with others in life, in their families, and in the church. The time they get to spend in nature opens their eyes to the glory and majesty in all creation. Even the meals they receive are used as a reminder that God has provided for them. Everything at the camps is used to teach these children about the love of God and how it can change their life.

Volunteers - what would we do without them?! Thank you to all those who have helped out so generously this past winter. If you have visited the Faith Mission warehouse some Thursday evening you would see one big "family" working together. At the folding table you hear several teens sharing recent happenings among their friends. Several people are busy placing clothes in the bins and visiting while they work. A few workers scurry back and forth, carrying clothes from the tables to the waiting carts. One gentleman jokes about the large pile of ladies' clothes (why are there always so many more ladies' garments than men's?). Two or three volunteers are busy running the baler. A number of young moms sit at the work tables, holding their babies and discussing mothering. Some are cutting up rags. Over there an adolescent is playing with a toddler and several more are giving young children rides in strollers or playing dress-up. What an enjoyable and blessed way to spend an evening. Once the tally numbers are around 300, it's time for a "loading evening". Many strong arms pitch in; a great way to build muscles without paying gym fees! Their efforts are rewarded with drinks, perhaps a snack, and the satisfaction that comes with knowing where these clothes are going and how much they will be appreciated. Our Thursday afternoon volunteers, who work from 1:00 - 4:00 pm take time out for faspa. They enjoy a simple snack of sandwiches and baked goods and fellowship around the table. Evening volunteers occasionally put together a potluck snack to enjoy after their 7-9:00 shift. It's a good time to celebrate birthdays and visit. Then spring comes. Farmers head out to the fields. Gardeners get itchy green thumbs. Young folks leave the confines of houses for baseball fields, in-line skates, bicycles, and camp-outs. And volunteers at Faith Mission dwindle down to a faithful few. Perhaps you have intended to come help sometime but it just hasn't happened yet. It seems it's much easier to do something if it's scheduled. We need some extra volunteers or groups to schedule in besides our regular volunteers. In the last 24 years since this was originally printed in the newsletter we have seen our volunteer base change quite a bit. Then we were putting out the call to get more groups lined up outside of our Thursday evening regular volunteers and now we are having conversations about closing the Thursday evenings because it seems very difficult to get more than a few people there a lot of evenings. Yes, we still have a very faithful "senior" volunteer base that come year in and year out, some that already would have been volunteering regularly in 2001 (or longer). But it seems the younger generation is very hard to convince that time spent volunteering is time well spent. I am calling on all of you maybe there is possibly a Thursday per month or even every 2-3 months that you can come and help fold clothes or run the baler? There is no sign-up required and no commitment needs to be made but the amount of work before us looks very daunting if we can't increase our volunteer numbers especially through the summer months.

Along with more casual volunteers, Faith Mission is also looking for some more volunteers that could help us with the following different projects: 1) The couple that has cut and sewn most of our book bags for the last years in Winkler are retiring, and we thank them for their years of service, but this causes us to look for someone to take over this responsibility 2) Excessive amounts of denim that need to be cut into more precise sized pieces and serged to make blankets (this can be broken into 4 separate jobs; cutting the patches, serging them, and sewing them together to make blanket tops and adding backing to them to complete the blankets). 3) Boxes full of short skirts and shorts that need to be altered into longer skirts. 4) We have boxes full of panties that are cut and ready to sew into the final product. We also have a lot of fabric that is ready to cut and sew into dresses. 5) Laundry ladies, it seems like the more clothing we receive and sort through, the more laundry we have. We do have a group of ladies that faithfully do laundry at FM and also some that choose to take it home with them, we are extremely grateful for each of these. The sewing projects mentioned can be picked up and taken home to complete and returned. If you prefer, these projects may also be worked on at Faith Mission. Please contact us to make arrangements. Although most of these immediate needs (and piled up projects) are in Winkler, we are also looking for volunteers in Grassy Lake and if you are willing to help please reach out regardless of your location and perhaps we can arrange something for you to do.

most of the boxes we send are distributed around Christmastime. Unfortunately the way the logistics worked out past Christmas we were unable to get a large portion of our boxes to Ukraine in time for Christmas. The beauty of this is that those boxes then are able to be distributed throughout the winter and into the Easter season. The attached 2 pictures are exactly such an Easter celebration in a boarding school in Verkhovina, where 3-400 children come to spend their weeks away from their homes. Many of these children come from single parent homes and the one parent that is to take care of them is busy working and cannot look after the children properly anyhow. Or they come from homes where they are subjected to different forms of abuse.

Either of these situations mean that for these children to be able to be in this boarding school is definitely better for them than being at home and many of them rejoice when they are able to leave home on a Monday and come here. Peter N took us to this school last March on our trip to Ukraine and we distributed gifts to one group of the children which was about a 1/3 of the students there and this Easter he was able to return and bring gift boxes to another group. You can tell by the smiles on these faces that the gifts they received is more than a box of goodies. It is a message of hope in a risen Saviour that is such a bright light in these mostly dim and grim lives. As our email address is on all our gift boxes we do receive emails from a few of the recipients and have shared some of them with you on the backside of this page.
